

The Saint Benedict Conference of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul

The St. Benedict Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul operates with a volunteer staff of eight parishioners. Throughout the week we receive email notifications of neighbors in need from the King County SVdP Council hotline, and visit 4 to 5 families each week. In 2016, we visited over 200 families, all within the St. Benedict Parish area. Their needs range from food and utilities assistance to requests for help with rent.

While fielding notifications from the Council is our principal activity, we also partner with the Human Concerns and Social Justice Commission at St. Benedict to provide Thanksgiving meals and Christmas presents to families and individuals unable to provide for themselves.
